The Opening Ceremony will be held Friday on 29th November 1996 at the "Campidoglio", (City Hall). The Mayor of Rome, Mr. Rutelli, will greet these famous scholars from the European Committee for the History of Sport in the hall called "Sala della Promoteca". This is not going to be just a formal opening ceremony, but also the preliminary Session of the Seminar itself, including the following presentations: Prof. John Mc Clelland ("La dimension européenne du sport 1350-1650"), from Victoria College University of Toronto - Canada; Prof. Richard Holt (Toward a general History of modern European Sport"), Montford University Leicester - England; and Prof. Alighiero Manacorda (Diana e le Muse: sport e cultura sono inseparabili").

M. DI DONATO'S SCHOLARSHIP

In order to support young lecturers aged under 35 (date of birth: from 1961 on) in their activity, THE CENTRO STUDI ISEF DI FIRENZE and PANATHLON INTERNATIONAL - CLUB CLITUNNO offer two scholarships amounting to 500 Ecu each. This award is to honour Prof. Michele Di Donato, the most important Italian scholar who emphasized importance of the History of Physical Education and Sport. The prize will be awarded to the two most interesting and original papers presented at the 1st CESH Seminar of Rome. Many thanks to these two centres of Sports culture that were considerably concerned about our message: *Cognita historia, futurum figurare!*

DRAFT PROGRAMME

If you still haven't received the Seminar draft programme, you should know that there are more than 70 registered speakers from 20 different countries (4 non European Countries: Canada, China, Nigeria, Australia). We will, therefore, organize the Seminar in three parallel working sessions.

The *Scuola dello Sport* will provide an additional hall equipped with multimedia aids to show new issues, books, videos etc. So, we invite you to show your publications over the last ten years. This is a good opportunity to know the best research in the field of sports history in the world. For three days, the *Scuola dello Sport* will be occupied by the CESH.

THE DAYS IN GÖTTINGEN

The CESH Scientific Committee had a meeting in Göttingen on April 26 to 28 1996 to examine the abstracts submitted and to organize a draft programme.

The meeting was held in Krüger House, a wonderful water-mill dating back to the eighteenth century located in the countryside of the Northern Saxony.

We worked rapidly thanks to the experience of all the CESH members and, above all, of the President, Prof. Arnd Krüger.

The papers were divided into 14 working groups: Sources and theoretical basis, Sport and Culture, Sport and the Army, Water Sports, sport for men and for women, sport and Religion, Sport and nationalism, Sport and Society, Teacher Formation, Panem et Circenses, sport and Fascism, Science of Sport.

THE CESH LOGO

The CESH logo was designed by Giuseppe Stuto, of ARCHEOMEDIA® (a company dealing with multimedia products above all in the field of archaeology).

The design originates an Attic red-figure kylix made by the painter of Colmar, from Chiusi, VI century BC, stored in the Ashmolean Museum - Oxford. A young naked boy, holding some food in his left hand (meat?) covered with a cloth, turning to look at the hoop he is rolling with a small stick in his right hand. The hoop (or *trochos*)

was changed with the circle of stars, symbol of the European Community, as our Committee essentially is European and it is member of the European Network of Sport Sciences.
